

Objective: To outline the basic steps of Anchoring and provide a reference during vessel specific training.

<u>Identify</u>

- The ideal anchorage area is a large sand patch which is free of rock and coral that will provide space for the anchor chain to move as the vessel swings.

Ready The Anchor

- 1. Ensure anchor rode will run free by verifying that is free of knots and well
- 2. Remove keeper line and Pall (chain stop)
- 3. Ensure captain and crew are ready to drop anchor

Drop

- 1. Lower anchor on Captains order
- 2. Inform captain once anchor has reached the bottom
- 3. Pay out appropriate scope and inform captain (Min 3:1)
- 4. Ensure hand signals reflect direction and angle of rode in relation to vessel.
- 5. Standby for further instructions from Captain

Watch

 Captain or 1st mate must maintain constant watch over anchor and monitor for drag and/or vessel swing
